

## **Platinum Jubilee Commemoration – Survey Results**

A request for ideas for the area (covered by the WWPC boundaries) to commemorate the Platinum Jubilee was circulated with the March edition of the Flyer. In sum, 36 responses were received by the end March cut-off date. Votes were allocated as per number of adults in the household and for multiple options, they were listed as 1<sup>st</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> choice in order of being presented on the form.

No response proposed doing nothing for the Jubilee, but it could be assumed that a failure to respond could indicate that intent.

The outright winner of 1<sup>st</sup> choice options was the renovation of the Queen Victoria fountain, with the option of placing a reference to Queen Elizabeth's jubilee on the fountain. That received 16 votes. Second was the placing of a tree (an oak was the most popular choice) on the Green, with 12 votes. All other ideas scored significantly less, or zero, as first choice options.

Based on these results, the options for going ahead include:

1. Do Nothing, based on the low return of voting slips.
2. Engage a local mason to present ideas and costs for renovating the QV Fountain. This would require discussion between WVCA (as sponsors of the survey) and the Parish Council. Funding would be an issue for that discussion.
3. Consider the second-choice option, which is in keeping with Her Majesty's own wishes and would be of fairly low outlay cost. This would require Parish Council permission.
